**The Use of Computer Modeling, Analysis and Simulation
for Policy Evaluation in Chinese Corporations and Government**

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Theme of the Track

The use of computational models and simulations for social scientific research and policy evaluation has been growing rapidly in recent years in a wide variety of industries and academic disciplines, as well as governmental and non-governmental organizations. Several professional associations have emerged in response to the rapid global expansion of this methodology; e.g., the Pan-Asian Association for Agent-based Approaches in Social Systems Sciences (<http://www.paaa.asia/>), the European Social Simulation Association (<http://www.essa.eu.org/>), and the Society for Modeling & Simulation International (<http://scs.org/>).

This track seeks contributions – methodological, theoretical, and/or policy-oriented – that explore new ways in which computer modeling and simulation can be utilized in understanding and facilitating the process of Chinese globalization. Papers could address the following themes (proposals for other topics are welcome).

- How can Chinese corporations and governmental organizations utilize computer modeling and simulation in their predictive analysis of the challenges of globalization?
- How can agent-based and/or systems-dynamics models be used to solve specific social policy challenges in China – domestically or internationally?
- How can network models inform decisions in globalized economies?
- How can we strengthen international networks between computer social simulation modelers in China and others around the world?

The goal of the track is to bring together a variety of perspectives on these issues. Papers will need to be presented within approximately 20-30 minutes as part of a panel.
